Dear Senator Wyden:

On behalf of the more than 2 million retirees and future retirees represented by the National Retiree Legislative Network (NRLN), I am writing to oppose **S. 3234, Social Security Solvency and Sustainability Act**, and state that we are pleased the Senate Committee of Finance has not brought up the bill for a vote.

The NRLN opposes **S.3234** because both the early retirement age and full retirement age would be increased at least 67 and 70 by 2037. After 2040, the retirement ages would be increased relative to life expectancy.

The NRLN believes this proposed method for calculating benefits would result in lower Social Security benefits due to the extended number of years required for eligibility. In addition, many Americans in physically demanding jobs would not be able to continue to work to age 67 or 70.
