Dear Representative Doggett:

On behalf of the more than 2 million members of the National Retiree Legislative Network (NRLN), I am requesting that you support calling for votes in the Subcommittee on Health on two bills: H.R.2377, Saving Access to Laboratory Services Act (SALSA), and H.R.2474, Strengthening Medicare for Patients and Providers Act.

H.R.2377 would address what has been years of deep Medicare payment cuts, while updating Medicare's payment system to ensure clinical laboratory services are sustainable. Between 2017 and 2022, payment for some common tests for diseases like diabetes, cancer, and heart disease were cut by 27%. The next round of Medicare cuts would lower reimbursements up to another 15% for about 800 laboratory tests used to screen and manage many serious diseases. It is essential that Congress protect patients by acting this year to fix the Medicare payment model for clinical diagnostic tests.

H.R.2474, would address payment uncertainty affecting Medicare-participating physicians and avoid a possible physician shortage for Medicare beneficiaries. H.R. 2474 would change the physician payment rate above the current law by providing an annual Medicare physician payment update tied to inflation, as measured by the Medicare Economic Index (MEI). The Medicare Trustees and MedPAC have called for legislation to address the Medicare physician payment system by providing an annual inflation-based update tied to the Medicare Economic Index (MEI). A March 2023 report from the Medicare Trustees states that the trustees "expect access to Medicare-participating physicians to become a significant issue in the long term" unless Congress takes steps to bolster the payment system.
