The Forum message provides tips on how to become prepared so you can get the best deal for your senior healthcare coverage. Preparation is important If you are enrolling in Medicare for the first time or at any time during 2023 and in future years. Get prepared before you call a healthcare insurance company, an insurance agent or that advertised 800 number in commercials.
